Only twelve states are unreported as of August 5, 1969; but among them are five of the biggest ones: California, Pennsylvania, Illinois, Chio, Texas. The total for thirty-eight states (a little more than  $\$3\frac{1}{2}$  billion) will rise to more than  $\$5\frac{1}{2}$  billion for the fifty states.

CONNECTICUT. Correction. A \$\tipsi\_50,000 appropriation, originally introduced to make some shoreline improvements, was eventually transferred by parliamentary maneuvering to Eastern Connecticut State College at Willimantic for the purchase of library books and periodicals.

This raised the statewide total for fiscal year 1969-70 (as reported in Table 86, GRAPEVINE page 828) to \$80,320,000. This shift is illustrative of the adage that almost anything can happen in a legislature until it adjourns.

DELAWARE. The legislature has acted upon the recommendation of Governor Peterson and enacted a package of new and increased taxes estimated to produce about \$14 million a year in additional revenue. There were increases in cigarette and tobacco taxes; and the corporation income tax was raised to 6 per cent from the former 5 per cent. Included also are various levies on manufacturers, contractors, wholesalers, and food processors.

The total for fiscal year 1969-70 is a gain of 55 per cent over the comparable figure for fiscal year 1967-68, two years earlier.

The ten-year gain since fiscal year 1959-60 is  $376\frac{1}{2}$  per cent.

No funds were appropriated for capital outlay. A constitutional amendment to extend bonding authorization under the Higher Education Bond Act of 1963, which expired June 30, 1969, will be on the ballot at the general election in November 1969. If approved, it is thought that about \$60\$ million will be provided for the next biennium.

The total for fiscal year 1969-70 is a gain of  $58\frac{1}{2}$  per cent over the comparable sum for fiscal year 1967-68, two years earlier.

The ten-year gain since fiscal year 1959-60 is  $742\frac{1}{2}$  per cent.

MAINE. The legislature "took the plunge" by enacting wholly new taxes on personal and corporate incomes. The personal income tax will be graduated from 1 per cent to 6 per cent of net taxable income, based on federal adjusted gross income and federal deductions; the latter to be estimated at 10 per cent in all cases. Individual exemption is \$1,000. The new measure is expected to yield about \$50 million of additional revenue during the ensuing biennium.

The total for fiscal year 1969-70 is a gain of 48 per cent over the comparable figure for fiscal year 1967-68, two years earlier. The ten-year gain since fiscal year 1959-60 is 601 per cent.

The total for fiscal year 1969-70 is apparently a gain of 32 per cent over the comparable figure for fiscal year 1967-68, two years earlier.

The ten-year gain since fiscal year 1959-60 appears to be  $219\frac{1}{2}$  per cent.

MORTH CAROLINA. A new landmark! The legislature enacted a tax of 2 cents per pack on cigarettes, making North Carolina the fiftieth state to enact a cigarette tax. The rate is merely nominal, compared with cigarette tax rates in most other states.

Effective July 1, 1969, this state also increased the gasoline tax to 92 cents from the former 72 cents; raised the levies on liquor, beer, and the sale of vehicles, boats, and planes.

SOUTH CAROLINA. Early in 1969 the legislature raised the state general sales tax to 4 per cent from the former 3 per cent. More recently it stepped up the cigarette tax to 6 cents a pack from the former 5 cents; and made fractional increases in the liquor and beer taxes. The new measure became effective June 1.

The total for fiscal year 1969-70 is a gain of 49 per cent over the comparable figure for fiscal year 1967-68, two years earlier.

The ten-year gain since fiscal year 1959-60 is  $340\frac{1}{2}$  per cent.

TENNESSEE. Correction. Several small additional sums were voted for operating expenses for fiscal year 1969-70 in the Miscellaneous Appropriations Act, passed the last day of the 1969 session. These raised the statewide total from \$86,595,000 (Tables 70 and 74, GRAPEVINE pages 814 and 818) to \$87,137,000. This raised the two-year gain to 35 per cent, and the ten-year gain to 412 per cent.
